Using the Google chart API (Application Programming Interface) a large number of charts can be made, from simple bar charts to map charts with pin markers, zoomed in to specified latitudes and longitudes. The charts can be made from data entered directly into HTML code or by pointing the API at an appropriate data source, such as a Google docs worksheet. Because this is an API the charts will not work offline. Basic charts can be made by simply manipulating the values given in Google's templates or using the Chart Wizard, while more and more complex charts can be created by delving more deeply into the code.
